WHEREAS, the Edison Board of Education has a Boys' Lacrosse Program and has agreed to accept the Metuchen High School students into the John P. Stevens High School Boys' Lacrosse program; and

WHEREAS, the Metuchen Board of Education and the Edison Board of Education have negotiated the terms of an agreement whereby the Metuchen High School students would be permitted to participate in John P. Stevens High School Boys' Lacrosse Program, at no cost to the Metuchen Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Schools recommends that the Metuchen Board of Education approve the Cooperative Sports Program to permit Metuchen High School students to participate in the John P. Stevens High School Boys' Lacrosse Program for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Metuchen Board of Education hereby:
