RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION TO BE MADE TO THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION FOR APPROVAL OF THE EDUCATIONAL PLANS, THE SCHEMATIC PLANS AND THE SCIENCE LAB ADDITION PROJECT, ANY REQUIRED AMENDMENT TO THE LONG RANGE FACILITIES PLAN AND OTHER RELATED ACTIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF METUCHEN IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY as follows:

1. The Board President, the Superintendent of Schools, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, the Project Architect, Bond Counsel and other appropriate representatives of the Board (the “Board Representatives”) are hereby authorized to submit the educational plans and the schematic plans for a school capital project involving construction of a science lab addition at Metuchen High School, including renovations, alterations and improvements, as necessary, and acquisition and installation of furnishings and equipment and site work (the “Project”), which plans are hereby approved in forms prepared by EI Associates (the “Project Architect”), together with such other information as may be required, to the State Department of Education for approval as an “other capital project”, and to make application to the Commissioner of Education for approval of the educational plans,

2. The Board Representatives are hereby further authorized and directed to submit the schematic plans and any other required information to the Planning Board and, if necessary, to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and to any other appropriate agency for review and comment.
3. The Project Architect has heretofore been authorized and delegated the responsibility to prepare the plans and specifications for the Project in consultation with and under the supervision of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, who has heretofore been delegated the responsibility to work with the Project Architect for this purpose on behalf of the Board, and such authorizations and delegations are hereby reconfirmed and ratified, all in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-16.
